


# 2017 eco-film series: be inspired




## End of the Line




## How to Let Go of the World




## Jumbo Wild




## Kombit

Previously the richest agricultural country in the Caribbean, Haiti has been deforested by 98%. *Kombit the Cooperative* follows this inspirational journey of a partnership striving to plant five million trees in five years (64 min).




