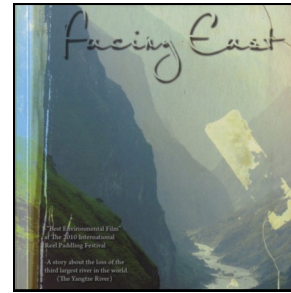

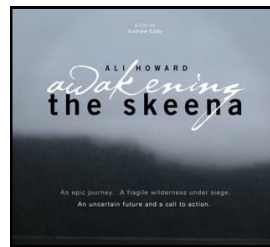

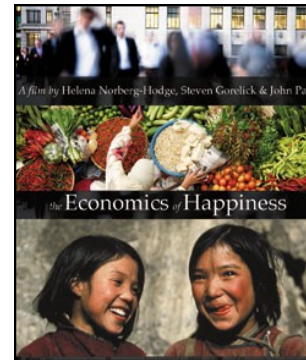
Come on a journey with a group of kayakers and explorers as they make the final descent of the Yangtze River.

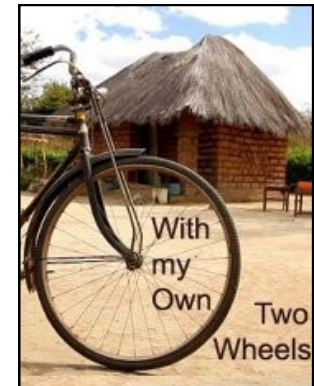

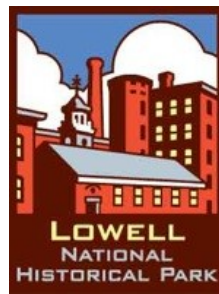

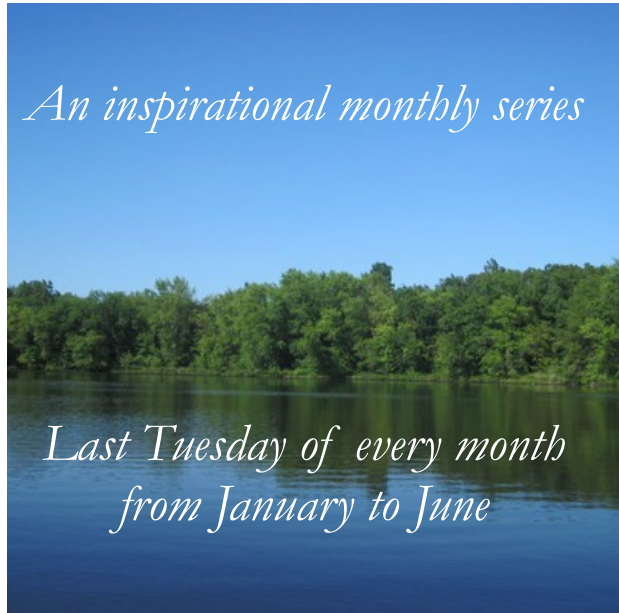
