- **Protected** over 30 acres for everyone in Lowell, including the Concord River Greenway and Jollene Dubner Park.

- **Activated** more than a thousand students each year as future conservation stewards through our after-school, STEM-based environmental education program offered in partnership with Mass Audubon and Lowell Public Schools.
- **Connected** thousands of community residents through year-round programs in our special places: **Hawk Valley Farm, Donahue Park, West Meadow, Spalding House, the Greenway**, and more.
